Father's Day



Background Information

While there are no records of festivals to honor fathers, the ancient Romans did have *Parentalia*, which lasted for more than a week in February. The festival honored departed parents and relatives to "appease the souls of your fathers," according to Ovid, an ancient Roman poet. Families would gather in a sort of reunion. Graves were decorated with offerings such as wine and honey left for the departed on the last day of the festival.

Like Mother's Day, Father's Day originated in the early years of the 20th century in the United States. The first record of a day for fathers is July 5, 1908, when a Father's Day church service was held in West Virginia. Sonora Dodd thought of having a Father's Day while listening to a sermon on Mother's Day in 1909. Her father, William Jackson Smart, had raised six children after the death of his wife. Mrs. Dodd fostered the idea in Spokane, Washington, and the first citywide observation was held on the third Sunday in June in 1910. Mrs. Dodd suggested wearing a white rose for a dead father and a red rose for a living father.

Interest in Father's Day increased as word spread about the Spokane event. However, unlike Mother's Day, it was many years before the day became formalized. In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge recommended that it be "noted" in the states. He would not issue a formal proclamation, even though Mother's Day had been formalized in 1913 by President Woodrow Wilson. Resolutions were introduced into Congress, but it wasn't until 1972 when President Richard Nixon signed a Congressional resolution that the day caught up to Mother's Day.

Fathers are given cards and gifts, with clothes, electronics, tools, and sporting goods being the most popular. Uncles, grandfathers, and men who fill the role of a father are often honored as well.

Around the World

Father's Day is celebrated in many countries around the world, many on the same day as in the United States. In Australia, South Africa, and the United Kingdom, organized groups often gather to celebrate, with children urged to honor their dads.

Pencil Holder for Dad
